Dear Neighbors,

I write regarding several matters of interest:

1. **Budget and Tax Ordinances.** Enclosed are copies of the tax and budget ordinances adopted by the Glenview Commission for the year from July 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. If you have questions regarding the tax rate or the budget, please let us know.

2. **Survey Regarding Road Safety.** You recently should have received a letter noting the Glenview Commission's concerns regarding motor vehicles operating at unsafe speeds. The letter noted that the results of a recent speed study have been posted on Glenview's website and included a short survey. Some residents already completed and returned the survey; if you have not done so, I hope that you will either complete the survey or find another way to communicate your thoughts regarding this topic to a member of the Commission.

3. **New Commissioners.** Since our last newsletter, two members left the Glenview Commission, and two have joined. Following a decade of diligent service to Glenview, Don Bennett, MD, concluded his service to the Commission. If you see Don, I hope you will thank him for his many years of dedicated service to Glenview.

John Warmack died earlier this year. John, a licensed architect, played a critical role in the preparation of Glenview's Design Standards Manual, which the Commission has now named in his honor. If you see Deby Warmack, I hope you will extend your condolences to her.

Larry Stickler has succeeded Don Bennett, and Bruce Merrick has succeeded John Warmack. I hope you will encourage and support each of them in their service to our community.

4. **Commercial Property Maintenance.** Finally, a number of residents have expressed concern regarding the operation of commercial mowers, blowers and other noisy equipment during the evening hours and weekends, when neighbors may be trying to conduct parties, dinners, special events, or simply trying to enjoy the outdoors at their homes. The Commission is reviewing alternatives to mitigate this challenge. In the meantime, I ask that you direct your landscaping crews to confine their operation of noisy equipment to the hours between 8:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. and not to operate at all on Sundays and holidays. Thank you for your thoughtfulness for your neighbors.
