Ordinance 4, Series 2010

Enclosed is the City's newest Ordinance. MSD has been working with the City to help hide the unsightly generator they installed at the entrance of Brittany Woods Circle. Clerk Administrator and resident Mike Peter worked with MSD on the beautification of this entrance. A BIG THANKS to Mike Peter, Richard Bean, Mary Barney, and Charles Buhl who all helped on making this signature entrance of Glenview look lovely. Ordinance 4, Series 2010 states that the City will maintain a fence within the right-of-way of Lime Kiln Lane, north of Brittany Woods Circle. At first, Public Works was asking for a \$10,000 Surety Bond and Liability Insurance but City Engineer Mark Adams spoke to Rick Storm with Public Works and Mr. Storm has agreed to waive the License Agreement bond, insurance and permit fee required for the proposed 4-board fence on the condition that the City of Glenview adopts an ordinance with the following provisions: The City of Glenview shall maintain the 4-board fence; The City of Glenview shall remove the 4-board fence and restore the Metro Right-of-Way at the request of Metro Government; The City of Glenview shall accept the responsibility and liability related to the 4-board fence within the Metro Right-of-Way. The ordinance saves us some money and accomplishes the desired result.

City Commission

Commissioner Lisa Barr has served the City as a City Commissioner for 3 terms (6 years) and decided not to run again this election. She will truly be missed. Her replacement, Commissioner Dr. Donald Bennett will start his first term January 2011. Welcome Dr. Bennett. Thank you Lisa for your invaluable volunteer service to Glenview.

Winter Road Care

The City has re-newed our contract with Vaughn Construction for snow removal. They did a great job the past 3 winters, and we look forward to working with them again. They will not be plowing private drives, if you want your private drive plowed it will be your responsibility to hire someone.

Insurance Tax Premiums

Insurance premium taxes have been discussed in the *GLENVIEW NEWSLETTER* on several occasions. The State of Kentucky provides a tax on insurance premiums. The City must be on record requesting the funds. Glenview went on record several years ago and this valuable revenue stream has helped to keep the Glenview property tax rate extremely low. Please make sure your agent or insurance company is aware that you live in Glenview. This is extremely important if you have a zip code other than 40025. If your insurance company is not aware that you live in Glenview the tax revenue will go to Metro Louisville by default. Attached are a few more stickers for your premium payments.
